
Perennials In Your Landscape

 Water-wise and xeriscape are used synonymously, but they don't imply that it can't be lush and green.





7 Principles of Water-Wise or Water Efficient Landscaping

- Planning and design
- Know your soil type
- Proper plant selection (right plant in the right place)
- Efficient irrigation practices
- Create <u>practical</u> turf areas
- Use of mulches / hard-scape
- Regular maintenance





Principles that work!


- Choose the right plants.
- Put them in the right place.
- Water them properly.

 Our biggest challenge and problem is in our own behavior. We kill more plants and invite in more pests and problems than would occur naturally because of our behavior.

Things to think about with Perennials

- Choose varieties that bloom at different times
- Make sure to consider water needs and group plants with similar needs together
- Go with interesting foliage for color all year
- Don't use straight lines when planting
- Plant in odd numbers
- Have focal points- these can change through the season
- Plan for full sized plants when you design and when you plant






Daphne cneorum 'Ruby Glow'

- -Best in full sun.
- -Grows 12 inches tall may spread to 3' wide.
- -Often grown in rock gardens
- -Cutting back will keep plant compact
- -Does best in well drained soil.
- -Zone 5-9

Pasque Flower

Pulsatilla vulgaris



- -Very early bloom
- -Best in full sun to part shade.
- -Grows less than12 inches tall and wide
- -Comes up early with the bulbs.
- -Zone 4-8

- spring to early summer
- -Beautiful yellow gold
- -1 ft tall to 3 ft wide spreading
- -best in full sun
- -Good rock garden plant
- -foliage can burn a bit in hot summer sun
- -good border planting
- -Zones 4-9

- -Blooms June –July
- -1 to 3 ft tall
- -Prefers full sun to part shade and fertile soils.
- -Once a week watering.
- -Dead head spent flowers and cut back in fall.
- -Zones 4-9

Kniphofida 'Early Hybrid'



- -Yellow to red in color
- -3 to 4 ft. tall
- -Summer bloomer
- -Drought and heat tolerant
- -Many varieties available
- -Once a week to 2 week watering.
- -Dead head spent flowers
- -One time fall or spring cut back to ground.
- -Zones 5-8

Rock Cress Aubrieta sp.



- Early Spring Bloomer
- 12 inches tall, spreading, drooping.
- various color choices
- Full sun to part shade
- -Good plant for rock walls or foundation planting.
- -Zones 4-9

- -Shrubby perennial/ evergreen shrub
- -Blooms in a Late Spring
- -Many colors and varieties
- -12 inches tall 24 in. wide
- -Zone 4-9

- -Full sun to part shade
- -Prefers moist, but well drained soil
- -Generally evergreen flowering in spring and summer, goes dormant in the summer heat.
- -Zone 5-7



- -Half-shrubby, dwarf, spreading, semievergreen,
- -April to May its neat tufts of dark green change into masses of snowy white.
- -Zone 4-9
- -Nice border plant or rock garden plant.

- Spring Bloomer
- 18 inches tall
- Nice foliage
- Variable color options
- Prefers a bit more water and will thrive in shaded areas (will tolerate full sun).

- -Fast growing, used as a ground cover.
- -Flowers in spring
- -Nice foliage color and texture
- -Partial shade, to full shade
- -Many varieties
- -Prefers moist, but well drained soil
- -Zones 4-8

Firecracker Penstemon

Penstemon eatonii

- -Early spring bloom
- -1 to 3 ft tall and wide
- -Prefers poor nutrient soils, will rot with organic mulches.
- -No water once established
- -Dead head spent flowers for nice folaige through summer.



Rocky Mountain Penstemon

Penstemon strictus



- -Perennial, low water use
- -2 to 3 ft tall and wide
- -Spring blooming (May)
- -Cut back when flowering has finished.
- -Water every 7-10 days.

Gooseberry Globemallow

Sphaeralcea grossulariafolia




- -Grows 4 in. to 3 ft. tall.
- -Silvery green foliage.
- -Blooms late spring to summer.
- -Full sun.
- -One of few native orange flowering species.
- -No water if established
- -No real maintenance
- -Zones 4-8

- -Perennial 4-5 ft tall
- -White to pink flower
- -Blooms spring and early summer
- -Very fragrant, bee attractor
- -Prefers sandy soil
- -Will grow in clay with no
- -Cut spent blooms for attractive summer foliage





- -Summer bloomer
- -Drought and heat tolerant
- -Many varieties available
- -Once a week to 2 week watering.
- -Dead head spent flowers
- -One time fall or spring cut back to ground.
- -Zones 5-8

- -Dark green foliage, mounding and spreading as a boarder plant or tall ground cover.
- -Blooms summer
- -Full sun to part shade
- -Medium water and low maintenance
- -12 in. tall
- -Zones 5-9

- -Full sun to part shade
- -2 to 3 ft tall
- -Summer bloomer
- -Also a white variety
- -Will tolerate lower water use but not in extended heat spells.
- -Zones 5-9

- -Full sun to part shade
- -Prefers cooler climates
- -1 to 3 ft tall
- -Range of blue, red, pink, yellow, white blossoms.
- -Bloom early summer
- -once per week if in cooler zone and in part shade.
- -Zones 4-9



- -Full sun to part shade
- -18 in tall
- -Evergreen foliage
- -Spring to summer bloomer
- -Range from pink to purple color
- -Adaptable to soil types and water
- -Will self seed.

-Flowers all summer



- -Yearly cut back for maintenance.
- -Zones 3-9

- -Yellow to orange petals with red center, or all burgandy.
- -Very tolerant of dry conditions. Will tolerate more or less water
- -Deadhead for extended flowering

- -24-36 in. wide and tall
- -Prefers full sun
- -Flowers summer





- -2-3 ft tall and wide
- -Nice dark green foliage
- -Cut back once per year during spring cleanup
- -Goes nice with black eyed susan and various ornamental grasses



-Bloom colors include: White, pink, purple, yellow, burgundy.

-Water once weekly.

-Pruning and dead head for most attractive look.

-Zones 5-10

Desert Four O'clock

Mirabilis multiflora



- -Perennial to 2' tall from a tuber
- -Comes from base in late spring
- -Lush, dark green leaves
- -Flowers midsummer to frost
- -Breaks off at base after frost for easy fall or spring clean up.
- -From 2300-7500 ft

- -Full Sun, good drainage, low water requirement, no water once established
- -Fast growing, flowers first year from seed
- -Requires a lot of room (8 ft. wide)

Hummingbird Flower

Zauschneria latifolia

- -Perennial to 12 in.
- -Foliage dark green
- -Flowers scarlet
- -Flowers midsummer through frost
- -No water needed once established.
- -Once per year cleanup is all that is needed.
- -Zone 4-10



- -Full sun to partial shade, medium to low water requirement
- -Fast growth, great ground cover for dry shaded areas. Humming birds love it.

- -Can clime to 30 ft. Needs supporting structure.
- -Tolerates poor soil and dry conditions.
- -Prune winter or early spring.
- An easy woody perennial vine to grow. Pref. full sun.

Grape species Vitis x spp



- -Many varieties to choose
- -Does well on occasional water once established.
- -Fast growing
- -Best in full sun.
- -Prune yearly to control size.
- -Hardiness depends on variety. Nice landscape vine as well as producer.

Japanese or Chinese Wisteria Wisteria floribunda Var.



- -Very showy, fragrant flowers that grow in long racemes
- -Flower color is purple, bluepurple or lilac although there is a white cultivar
- -Can grow on a structure up to 65 ft.
- -Grows best in full sun.
- -Will take several years to mature before any flowering will occur.

 With expected population growth, there will be 40-50,000 new homes every 10 years. Each with a landscape to water.


 Current water supply won't meet demand unless there is a reduction in use or future supply is developed.
